Background: <u>SB125</u> established the Transit Transformation Task Force (TTTF) to develop policy recommendations to grow transit ridership, improve the transit experience, and address long-term operational needs. The California State Transportation Agency (CalSTA) appointed 25 members to the TTTF, including representatives from state government, local agencies, academic institutions, advocacy organizations, and other stakeholders. CalSTA, in consultation with the TTTF, will prepare a report of findings and policy recommendations based on the TTTF's efforts and submit it to the Legislature by October 31, 2025.

- Consensus on the importance of a robust and sustainable transit system for California
 - Public transit is the backbone of future mobility options, and it is crucial to keep this a viable choice for all.
 - o Importance of the "Core 4" this effort: safety, equity, climate action, and economic prosperity.
 - Can connect communities across all different types (urban, suburban, rural)
- Variety of challenges facing California's transit systems discussed
 - Funding and revenue decline, workforce shortages, disconnected systems and lack of alignment
 - Safety concerns on transit impact ridership and employee well-being

Transit Transformation Task Force (TTTF) – Meeting #1 December 19, 2023 Approved Meeting Minutes

- Accessibility concerns and unique challenges faced by lowincome, vehicle-less, disabled, rural and smaller communities
- Increasing ridership, revenue, and ridership experience
 - Attendees emphasized the need for safe, reliable, affordable, and accessible public transportation options for all Californians
 - Provide convenient options for low-income and vulnerable populations, increased frequency and access points, paratransit inclusion
 - Explore land use and pricing strategies to encourage transit use
 - Communicate positive changes and education about transportation benefits
- Importance of equity
 - Affordable and accessible transportation is key to equity and ensuring transit benefits for all
 - Need to include not only urban, but rural and suburban communities as well
 - Ensure equitable representation on planning committees and decision-making bodies
 - Important to represent rural and small agencies, transit drivers and operators, low-income riders and paratransit riders, construction and labor organizations, planners, and other institutional players
