San Diego Ride Along Event on April 15, 8:30 – 10:15 am

San Diego transit advocates organized a public Ride Along to the April 15 Task Force meeting. The Ride Along will begin at 8:30 am at Seahorse Coffee, 1301 Market Street near the Park & Market Trolley Station in Downtown San Diego, and end by 10:15 am at the Task Force meeting location at 4050 Taylor Street. Update – TWG Meeting #2 Summary

The TWG met on March 26, 2024 to explore a preliminary set of options for goals, metrics, and changes required for California to achieve a 4-6x increase in ridership. During the meeting, the group discussed: 1) The state of transit availability today; 2) Types of customer goals and metrics to facilitate mode shift and how they might vary by geography, mode, trip distance, and trip purpose; and 3) A list of topics, directly and indirectly related to transit, that might impact California's ability to meet those goals.

This preliminary set of options will be presented by the TWG members on April 15 for your consideration.

Update – TTTF Homework Synthesis

At the end of our last TTTF Meeting #2 on February 29, 2024, we presented two

questions:

- 1. What challenges and constraints need to be investigated and addressed to achieve 4-6x in ridership by 2045?
- 2. What other goals (besides ridership) do you view as critical outcomes for the work of the TTTF (e.g., equity, sustainability)?

Thank you to everyone who responded to these questions. Your comments and responses are valuable inputs into future TTTF and TWG meetings.

The responses to Question 1 highlighted opportunities to improve the end-to-end experience for customers, security, service levels, changing environment and employment patterns, constraints in funding for transit, less accommodating policy environment, and increase in car ownership. The responses to Question 2 included goals around customer experience, funding, agency coordination, equity, community, and the environment.
